It has been suggested that that Deer don't like fuzzy leaves (they ate Lamb's ears) and that they won't eat aromatic plants but I know they ate Artemisia. Often they will not eat prickly plants (they like rose bushes) although Thistles and stinging nettle might be good to grow. Ferns and Grasses would be good candidates as they leave these alone in the wild.
