

Shade Loving Clematis



***Clematis alpina* 'Pink Flamingo,' Alpine Clematis.** This clematis is cherished for being one of the earliest and most profusely flowering. Dangling mauve pink flowers with a deep pink blotch are followed by decorative, silky seed heads. It is wonderful as groundcovers, cascading over walls, and climbing in trees and shrubs. It blooms on old wood, therefore any pruning should be performed right after flowering. The fact that it does not require pruning makes it perfect as a groundcover or where pruning is difficult. Pruning Group A.



***Clematis paniculata (terniflora),* Sweet Autumn Clematis.** It grows to 10-20' and has clusters of creamy white sweetly scented flowers in Sept.-Oct. Feathery seed heads follow the blooms. It does well in sun or shade. Cut back half way. Pruning group A, B or C.



***Clematis viticella* 'Venosa Violacea,' Italian Clematis.** It has 4-5" flowers of white background with purple veins throughout, turning all purple on the edges, which are very distinctive. Pruning Group C.



'Alabast.' It has large creamy pale green flowers which have an attractive round shape. It blooms May-June and August. It does well in shady areas out of full sun, and is considered a premium variety.



‘Multi-Blue.’ It has very double dark blue to purple 4-5” flowers. It blooms late spring to early summer and again late summer on to fall, but always double flowers and is considered one of the best double flowering Clematis! Remove dead wood in spring. It blooms on both old and new wood. It is best in light shade. Pruning Group B1.



‘Nelly Moser.’ It has mauve blossoms with a deep lilac bar and red anthers. It blooms May-June and August-September. It thrives in shade, is free flowering and reaches 10’ tall. Pruning Group B1.



‘Silver Moon.’ It has very large 6”-7” silvery –mauve flowers which have creamy-white anthers, and overlapping petals. It blooms June, July and late August and does well in full to partial shade. Pruning Group B2.



‘Sugar Candy.’ It is a repeat bloomer for the shade. It has huge, 7” luscious pink blooms which have a deeper pink strip down the middle of each petal. Blooms are produced in lavish abundance during two big flushes, first in early summer and again in fall. It is best grown where not exposed to direct sunlight. Pruning Group C.

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
